Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Our journey together in the in between time for the congregation has been invigorating for me. Thank you for your support and your willingness to open yourself to our adventure in the realm of Spirit.



You have supported two major workshops, one was the "Good Life Together" workshop and the second was a strategic planning retreat where we came to a consensus on a mission and vision for the congregation going forward. The mission that is proposed is, "Seeking First the Kingdom of God for good, for others, forever." This builds on Jesus' teaching in the sermon on the mount where he encourages his disciples to "Seek first the Kingdom of God..." The "for good" piece means that we intend to "Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven." This is also the sermon on the mount as well as the charge in baptism. Good Works are the desired outcome of our life together. The "for others.." phrase orients the mission of the congregation as aiming at "others" who deeply need the "Kingdom of God." Finally, "forever" refers to the eternal nature of our life together where we live toward God and our eternal destiny.

The vision is borrowed from Julian of Norwich 1343-1416 who's mantra was, "All shall be well," all manner of things shall be well." This vision invites us into a wellness ministry where we extend the invitation of "Good Life Together" into the community. For instance, we may focus on "Good Life Together" in marriage, or in families, or among youth, or in the workplace such as health care institutions. The plan is to work on more specific mission objectives after the congregation approves the mission and vision.

These are exciting times to be the church and to launch a fresh mission and vision.

Altar Guild Mission – To prepare and adorn God's house for worship.

Our dedicated members quietly, efficiently prepare the sanctuary for worship every week. Are you aware? We bake and prepare the bread, purchase wine and white grape juice to pour into those little, tiny glasses for communion, launder altar linens, change the paraments for the seasons, put hymnals in place under chairs, place current hymn numbers on the hymn board every week, add liquid wax to the altar candles and hang seasonal banners.

Personalized banners are made for baptisms. Altar Guild trains and mentors our young members to perform the duties of acolyte and crucifer. On Palm Sunday we host our annual brunch. Easter lilies and poinsettias, purchased by our congregation to decorate the sanctuary, are placed and tended. Sweet treats are handmade and offered at Easter.

Monies raised at our bake sale and brunch pay for Sunday morning bulletin covers and communion glasses, helped pay for new kitchen stoves, and purchased our new communion trays which were blessed and then used initially at the Christmas morning worship.



Probably the biggest miracles in our life are our three children. After trying for several years, we were blessed with a healthy daughter. God blessed us by adding two more miracle children to our family through international adoption from the countries of Kazakhstan and China.

Kris was born in Des Moines, Iowa, and has three siblings, two older brothers, and a younger sister. Their father instilled in all three boys a love of mischief. Kris's father used to sneak him out of church on the pretense of keeping Kris in line, but then his dad would take him across the street and buy him an orange soda. Kris wonders if his dad pinched him to get him to misbehave in church!

Lisa was born in Emporia, Kansas,

and is an only child. As a child, Lisa rarely got into any trouble. A memory that stands out to her is the one time her father spanked her. Lisa kept pretending she was going to bite her dad's leg and he told her repeatedly that he would spank her if she actually bit him. Well, Lisa finally took a chance and nipped him, and sure enough, her father swatted her behind. Although it was not a hard spanking, it shocked Lisa because she had never had a spanking. It is something she's always remembered, and she respected her father for following through.

started asking why her parents did not attend church like her best friend did. It was at that time that Kris and Lisa began looking for a new church home and found Resurrection.

Growing up, Kris and Lisa moved several times. Lisa had lived in six states before the age of 15 and Kris had moved four times before graduating high school. After marrying, both Kris and Lisa were determined to raise their children in the same area. All three children were raised in the Derby, Kansas, area.

Marriah is currently in nursing school at WSU Tech and will graduate from their LPN program in May. She plans to continue schooling to get her RN license. After graduating from WSU in 2020, Roza is exploring life in Wichita and Emma is a freshman at Creighton University in Omaha, NE.

Both Kris and Lisa had long careers with Boeing/Spirit in Wichita. Lisa retired in 2014. Starting out in Industrial Engineering in 1986, most of her years at Spirit were spent managing various human resource departments. Kris started as an operations mechanic in 1984 and retired in 2019 from his executive role in program management.

Kris & Lisa have two dogs, Tippy, a bichon-poodle mix who is about 15 years old, and Snickers, a rat terrier mix. Kris found Snickers in a ditch, and she is believed to be about seven years old.

Our main goals are to see all three of our children happy and well and able to earn enough money so that they are comfortable. We hope to stay active in our church and dream of doing much more traveling over the next several years.

As a retired couple, Kris and Lisa enjoy traveling and church activities. Kris enjoys playing pickleball, riding his motorcycle, and taking care of the five acres they live on. Lisa loves to read and enjoys walking for exercise.
